Weather

Yosemite Valley

Today: Sunny, with a high near 91. Southeast wind 6 to 16 mph becoming southwest.

Tonight: Mostly clear, with a low around 54. Southwest wind between 13 and 16 mph becoming light. **Tuesday:** Sunny, with a high near 91. Light wind becoming southwest between 10 and 13 mph.

Tuesday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 55. West southwest wind between 7 and 10 mph becoming calm.

Wednesday: Sunny, with a high near 94. East wind around 7 mph becoming west southwest. **Wednesday Night:** Mostly clear, with a low around 55.

El Portal Area

Today: Sunny, with a high near 95. East wind 8 to 14 mph becoming south southwest.

Tonight: Mostly clear, with a low around 57. South southwest wind between 10 and 13 mph becoming calm. **Tuesday:** Sunny, with a high near 95. East wind at 9 mph becoming west.

Tuesday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 57. West wind at 8 mph becoming north.

Wednesday: Sunny and hot, with a high near 98. East northeast wind 6 to 9 mph becoming west southwest. Wednesday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 58.

Tuolumne Area

Today: Sunny, with a high near 69. Southwest wind 7 to 10 mph increasing to between 17 and 20 mph. Winds could gust as high as 23 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear, with a low around 37. Southwest wind 17 to 20 mph decreasing to between 7 and 10 mph. Winds could gust as high as 23 mph.

Tuesday: Sunny, with a high near 69. Southwest wind between 6 and 16 mph.

Tuesday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 39. Southwest wind between 12 and 15 mph becoming calm.

Wednesday: Mostly sunny, with a high near 71. Calm wind becoming south around 5 mph. **Wednesday Night:** Mostly clear, with a low around 39.

Happening This Weekend

- **Road Closures:** The Big Oak Flat road is closed from Highway 140 to Crane Flat and the Foresta road into the community of Foresta. There is no estimated time for the road to reopen. Highway 120 from Big Oak Flat entrance station is open to Crane Flat, on to Tuolumne Meadows, and Highway 395.
- Monday Aug 31 through Thurs: The District Forestry and Roads Crews will continue removing hazard trees and encroaching vegetation along the Valley Loop roads. Work will procede east along S. Side Drive from the Bridelveil Jct area. Traffic control with temporary delays will be in effect from 8:00am until 4:30pm
- The Superintendent's Bridge will be closed for repairs during the work week from the dates of August 31 to September 18. Alternative crossings can be made at Swinging Bridge, approximately .7 mile downstream, or Sentinel Bridge, approximately .3 mile upstream. Access will be allowed from Thursday evening to Monday morning during this time.

Park News

Residents in Old El Portal and Foresta are approved for administrative leave until the evacuation order is lifted. Please continue to check in with your supervisor on a daily basis.

If your work area is in Old El Portal (i.e. Fiscal Office, Vegetation Office, etc) and you have not been evacuated, please report to your work station Monday and report to your supervisor.

Please note that the Big Oak Flat Road (intersection at Crane Flat down to Hwy 140) is still closed to traffic. Only fire personnel or workers with fire orders will be allowed access. You must present appropriate paper work in order to be allowed through. (R Soden 8/31/09)

Note this change for seasonal/temporary employees: Seasonal and temporary uniform ordering cut-off date is September 1, 6:00 PM EST. Permanent and term uniform ordering cut-off date for FY 2009 remains the same: September 5, 6:00 PM EST. (M De Boer 8/31/09)

Current Situation: Yesterday, firefighters made good progress improving fire lines east of El Portal. The active portion of the fire is in the north and northwest flanks away from Foresta and El Portal. Today, the highest priority continues to be improving fire lines east of El Portal and structure protection in Foresta. Firefighters are aided by 11 water dropping helicopters and six air tankers. Control difficulties continue to be hot weather, low humidity, and steep terrain.

Public Meeting: A fire update meeting is scheduled for El Portal on Monday, August 31, at 6:30 pm at the El Portal School.

Evacuation Centers: An evacuation center has been established at the Mariposa Elementary School, 5044 Jones Street in Mariposa.

Road Closures: The Big Oak Flat Road from Crane Flat Gas Station to the intersection of El Portal Road and Big Oak Flat Road.

Trail Closures: Old Big Oak Flat Trailhead to El Capitan, Rockslides to El Capitan, Tamarack Creek to El Capitan.

Tioga Road Access Restricted Due to Big Meadow Fire

The Tioga Road in Yosemite National Park will have restricted access, between Crane Flat and White Wolf, beginning Monday, August 31, continuing until fire operations along the road are complete. This segment of the road will have controlled access with a pilot car during daylight hours, and be closed completely each night. Motorists should expect delays, which could begin as early as Monday morning.

The Big Meadow Fire continues to spread northeast and use of the Tioga Road for fire operations is necessary. Fire activity is dynamic and conditions may dictate a complete closure of Tioga Road at any time.

Visitors to Yosemite National Park may also experience delays on Route 140 due to fire operations. The Big Oak Flat Road, from Crane Flat Gas Station to the intersection of El Portal Road and Big Oak Flat Road, remains closed. In addition, Crane Flat and Tamarack Flat Campgrounds, Foresta, Old El Portal, and Yosemite View Lodge also remain closed. There is no projected opening date at this time.

The Big Meadow Fire in Yosemite National Park and Stanislaus National Forest has grown to 4,382 acres and is 50% contained. The Big Meadow Fire was set by Yosemite National Park Fire Crews on August 26, 2009 as a prescribed burn and shortly thereafter, the fire grew out of the prescription lines.

Construction Project Status Report – 08/28/09

Projects Managed by the Project Management Division, Construction Management Branch.

Integrated Utilities Phase 3a (Water line from Lower Pines CG to the Ahwahnee) -On-site work has begun and will continue into the fall of 2009.

- -The contractor is working on either side of, and on the south side of the Ahwahnee Bridge. The bike path on the west side of the bridge is closed during work hours, with pedestrian and bicycle traffic being detoured.
- -The secondary channel crossing east of the Ahwahnee Bridge is complete, restoration is underway.

Integrated Utilities Phase 3b

(Utility corridor in roadways from The Ahwahnee to east Yosemite Village)

- -This project is currently in the construction contracting phase
- -Construction will likely start toward the end of September.

Lower Tecoya Housing Utilities

(Water, sewer and power lines throughout the Lower Tecoya Housing area) -Work is expected to begin by mid September.

Yosemite Lodge sewer line repairs

-Construction work to start again in October

Replace Gas Chlorination Systems at 5 Utility Plants

-The project is now substantially complete.

Half Dome View Rehabilitation

--Substantial Completion inspection has been postponed until further notice due to Big Meadow Fire.

Replace Primary Electric to Wawona Tunnel

-This project is currently in the early design phase.

Crane Flat Water – Phase 1

-This project is currently in the construction contracting phase. -Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in mid September, 2009

Wawona Tunnel Ventilation Repair

-Continued installation of the carbon monoxide analysis system. -Continued work on emergency phone and traffic gate system.

Wawona Road Rehabilitation

-Design-resource investigations are ongoing.

Arch Rock Entrance Station Rehabilitation

-On-site work will not begin until after Labor Day.

Glacier Point Road Rehabilitation

-Work continues on brushing, guardwall installation and subgrade repair. This work is requiring traffic control on both Glacier Point Road and Wawona Road. Pilot cars will escort traffic from both ends of the project on the hour and half hour intervals.

-Please be cautious of trench plates and loose gravel at culvert crossings and subgrade repair areas.

Yosemite Creek Campground Bridge

-Removal of the existing Yosemite Creek Campground Bridge will begin on Monday, 8-31-09. Construction of the new bridge will follow removal of the existing bridge and then continue until the Tioga Road closes. (M Wichmann 8/31/09)
